1. Best Turned out – Lead Rein – *Rider 10yrs & under*
 2. Best Turned out
 3. Beginners Showing – *walk & trot only* – lead reins allowed
 4. First Ridden - *Not exceeding 13hh*
 5. Mountain & Moorland – Lead Rein – *Not exceeding 13hh*
 6. Mountain and Moorland – Small & Large Breeds – *in natural state*
 7. Show Hunter Type Pony – *Not Exceeding 14.2hh*
 8. Ridden Coloured
 9. Ridden Cob – *may be split into Trimmed & Natural state*

13. It is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure that they are entered in the correct class.
14. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure jumping courses are walked.
15. Entry to classes is subject to the secretary's and committee's decision. The judge reserves the right to disqualify, without refund any competitor who is late for their class. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure they are present for their class. If a competitor is not present for a class within 2minutes of being called into the ring they may be eliminated.
16. Hard hats must be worn fastened at all times when mounted and comply with British Safety standards. Body protectors and Medical Armbands are compulsory for Hunter Trials/Team Chase/Clear Round Cross Country Day's. They are advisable for open show days. Safety headwear/footwear advisable for grooms/handlers.
17. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure correctly fitting tack is used, fit for purpose and safe.
18. Boots are not permitted in showing classes, and not permitted in showing stage of working hunter classes.
19. Jewellery is not permitted.
20. Class 3, 25 and 31 are for true beginners and lead reins only.
21. Photographs will be taken at events by the LDRC approved photographer, if you do not wish for yourself or your child to be photographed please let a member of committee know
22. Data protection notice is available from our website or in the secretary's caravan

CLUB RULES

Disclaimer: All persons attend at their own risk, the club, committee and landowners do not hold themselves responsible for any loss, damage or injury to persons, animals or property, however caused. Sufficient 3rd party insurance is required by all competitors.

General:

1. The judge's decision is final. Any complaint must be put in writing to the club secretary with a fee of £30.
2. Classes may be combined or cancelled if there are insufficient entries.
3. Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times.
4. Age restrictions that apply to certain classes are taken from the 01.01.2019. Lead rein 10yrs and under. All riders to be 3yrs and over.
5. All ridden classes are confined to horses/ponies 4 years old and over.
6. All competitors must ride IN WALK across the showground in all areas unless in a designated warm up area.
7. Abuse towards any committee member, judge, steward, other competitors or animals will result in disqualification and dismissal from the showground.
8. Encouragement is expected but excessive assistance will result in disqualification.
9. Competitors must display the correct ribbons in tails of horses and ponies that kick (red) is young or inexperienced (green) or a stallion (white). Any animal considered dangerous will be asked to leave the ring or showground.
10. No Horse or Pony can compete in more than 4 jumping classes, maximum of 2 Show Jumping and 2 Working Hunter classes.
11. Any competitor seen misusing the whip or deliberately using the action of the bit as a means of punishment likely to cause pain or discomfort to horse/pony will be asked to leave the show ground immediately
12. All lead rein classes- rein must be attached to the noseband and NOT the bit.
